

## Downtown Denver Walking Tour Summary

3:00 – 5:30 pm

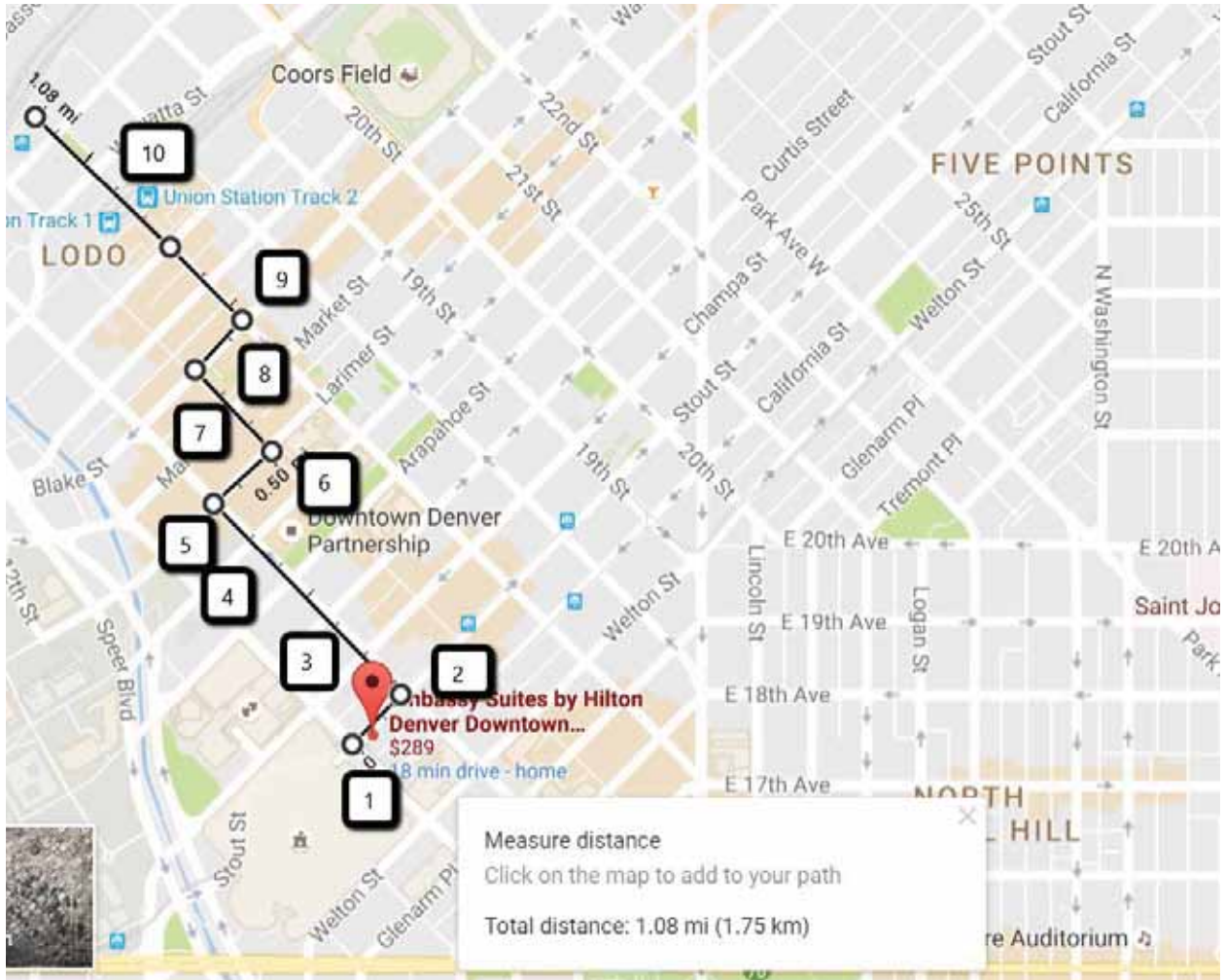
Walk2Connect led attendees of the Growth & Infrastructure Consortium conference on a walk in the downtown area that highlighted Denver's multi-modal transportation network and land use/planning and redevelopment policies (see following map). Walkers saw protected bike lanes, car sharing, free bus rides, multi-modal scenarios, historic renovation, pedestrian malls, mass transit thoroughfares, transit districts, light rail, and heavy rail. The walk began at the Embassy Suites lobby and concluded at Union Station with a briefing by the Dave Genova, general manager of the Denver Regional Transportation District (RTD), about his agency's new transportation and public/private partnership development initiatives. Walkers were able to return to the hotel by foot or the free 16<sup>th</sup> Street MallRide trolley, or connect to numerous other Denver destinations via transit from Union Station.

Start at **Stop 1:** 1st floor lobby at Embassy Suites



**Stop 2:** The Big Blue Bear, intersection of Stout and 15th Street



**Stop 3:** Protected Bike Lanes on 15th Street and throughout downtown



**Stop 4:** Car2Go and its parking rules



**Stop 5:** Larimer Square and End of Protected Bike Lane





**Stop 6:** 16th Street Mall (busses, bikes, peds, history, art) at Larimer St.



**Stop 7:** B-Cycle, Portable Toilets



**Stop 8:** RTD Headquarters



**Stop 9:** Union Station approach



**Stop 10:** Wynkoop (protected bike lanes), Union station terminal, Union Transit Area, A Train. Flatiron Flyer, Free MetroRide



**End at Union Station.**
